Sangwari works in the Surguja division in northern Chhattisgarh which is an underdeveloped region where more than 50% population is tribal.

MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS

- All consultations provided till date- 20318
- Pain and palliative care consultations-3347
- Home-based consultations-3856
- Community awareness sessions attended by- 1880 individuals
- Healthcare providers trained- 5537
- During the second wave of COVID-19, Sangwari ran a 20 bedded intensive care unit in the District Hospital, Ambikapur for a period of 3 months from May to August 2021. Close to 100 sickest patients were treated.
- A community-based home care and isolation program for COVID-19 in 26 villages of the district. A total of 140 COVID-19 patients were provided.
- Work of Sangwari in developing sickle cell unit at an Urban Primary Health Centre (UPHC) in Ambikapur was recognised by the honorable health minister and the health secretary of Chhattisgarh
- Memorandum of Understanding was signed with the State Health Resource Centre (SHRC) to jointly train various health care providers and conduct research
- Received approval from the state government to provide technical support to strengthen care of complex non-communicable diseases in the five districts of Surguja division.
